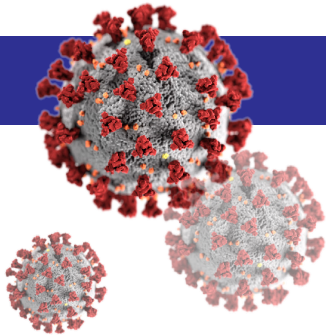


WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR TESTING?

- Bucks County School Employees and Contractor
- **NEW** - Bucks County Children Who Have Exhibited Symptoms of COVID-19 for at Least 24 Hours

Bucks County is providing FREE COVID-19 testing to those noted above as being eligible and specifically at the sites listed below. Specially trained staff will be administering Rapid Tests to adults and will direct parents/legal guardians in administering the Rapid Test to their child. You need not disclose any reason for wanting a test and you will be provided with the results while on-site.

APPOINTMENTS ARE REQUIRED FOR TESTING AT ALL SITES!

Employees and Contractors:

You must have your current, official, school-issued photo ID to be tested at all sites!

Children:

Every child must be accompanied by a parent/legal guardian who will be responsible for administering the nasal swab to the child.

Your test results are confidential and will not be shared.

Individuals can use the dated negative test result they receive on-site, in conjunction with the date they returned from travel or their last date of exposure, to be released from quarantine. If an individual tests positive, staff will do/direct a secondary (non-Rapid Test) to confirm the results (this will take another 20-30 minutes). If the second test is also positive, the staff/contractor will need to immediately call their school employer as per their employer's protocols and follow the process outlined by their school's Health and Safety Plan. If the second test is also positive for a child, the parent/legal guardian should inform the child's school/care facility of the results as per that organization's policy, if applicable.
