Morrisville Middle/Senior High School will become the Morrisville Intermediate/High School and will house grades 4-8 as "Intermediate School" and grades 9-12 as "High School.

Moved by Mr. Buckman; seconded by Mrs. Worob; passed by a roll call vote of 6 ayes; 2 nays. Members voting nay were Mrs. Heater and Mr. Kemp.

Mr. Buckman commented that even under the best of circumstances he does not believe we would have Reiter ready to open by fall.

Mr. Fitzpatrick stated that this is a separate issue than closing of a school; therefore, the board should consider it. Mrs. Heater stated she would support this as long as it is separate from closing a school. Mr. Kemp requested that a layout of this plan could be shared. Mr. Ferrara described the plan as discussed by administration.

Motion to table presented by Mr. Kemp

The Board DEFEATED a motion to table motion 4.1 – to approve the restructuring of the Borough of Morrisville School District, effective July 1, 2009. Grandview Elementary School will house grades PreK through 3. Morrisville Middle/Senior High School will become the Morrisville Intermediate/High School and will house grades 4-8 as "Intermediate School" and grades 9-12 as "High School.

Mrs. Worob stated that the new school would have been 10,000 sq. ft. less than what we have now.

7. LIAISON REPORTS

a. Lower Bucks County Vocational-Educational School – Mr. Buckman

Tech School is presenting "Little Shop of Horrors" on April 2, 3, and 4 in the new auditorium. Six students received awards at the Deca contest. Students received 13 gold medals, 14 silver and 8 bronze medals at the Skills America competition.

b. Bucks County Intermediate Unit #22 – Mrs. Mihok

Per Jack Brady, general assembly is currently in recess while the appropriations committee is conducting hearings on the commonwealth's budget. There is no call for any broad-based tax increases. However, it does include certain targeted taxes such as tobacco products. A committee will be formed to determine how best to move 501 school districts to no more than 100.

Monies from the stimulus plan are expected to provide a 2% special education increase.

c. Pennsylvania School Boards Association/Legislative – Mrs. Worob

Mrs. Worob asked the board and public to think about any platform issues for discussion at the PSBA convention. Mr. Hellmann added that Gov. Rendell is trying to consolidate school districts to make them more efficient; this is what our board is trying to do. Mrs. Worob explained this could take 2+ years to achieve.

Mrs. Worob would like to attend the April PSBA convention.

8. OLD BUSINESS

Update on Uniform Dress Policy – Mrs. Mihok/Mrs. Worob

This item will be discussed at the next meeting. We are gathering information and would like to form a committee. Please contact Mrs. Mihok or Worob if you are interested in serving on a committee.

Good Evening,

Many times in my position as a school board director I have been unable to respond to questions from audience members posed directly to me during the public comment portion of our meetings due to time constraints or simply too many topics on our agenda. For the first time I find it necessary to explain my position on an accusation that was directed to me by a pro-school parent at the December 17th, 2008 school board meeting.

It was my honor to represent the school board at the joint borough council / school board meeting on Thursday evening December 10th, 2008 along with fellow board members Vice President Al Radosti and Robin Reithmeyer with Council President Nancy Sherlock, David Rivella, and Ed Albertson for the borough. This meeting came after the first incident of fumes at M.R. Reiter when children were sent home early and the first day school was closed due to the continuing problems with the furnace. Mr. Radosti and myself had only been notified of the school closing that afternoon, Mr. Radosti by a phone call about 3pm, myself by way of an e-mail at 2:48 pm, and Mrs. Reithmeyer stated she had not been notified at all. It was blatantly obvious that the parents shouting out of turn from the audience were far more informed than members of the school board. I personally felt heartbroken for our students, sympathetic to our parents, and blind sided by our superintendent, and at a loss to answer questions that I should have had knowledge of well before this meeting. M. R. Reiter aside, every topic discussed concerned the health and safety of our students and how the council and the school board could mutually contribute to improve or alleviate ongoing problems.

At this time I brought up my perpetual safety issue of students walking in the middle of our streets on the way to school. Some of the children actually try to defy traffic to go around them rather than move to the sidewalk. My greatest fear is that one of our students will be seriously injured, so I do everything in my power to prevent a tragedy from happening. About fifteen years ago the administration advised me to take pictures of students as they walked in the street on the way to and from school to make it easier for the public safety officer to identify these individuals. The administration then sends a letter home to their parents or guardian to inform them that their children are putting themselves at risk for injury or worse. Everyone present at that meeting heard this discussion including pro-school parent and defeated school board candidate Jon Perry. However when Jon Perry spoke at the microphone at the emergency school board meeting just a few days later his recollection was distorted to the point of perversion.

Jon Perry stated he knew I was taking pictures of our students for years and with inflection in his voice asked why I would do that and questioned what I did with the pictures. This invoked an "ooooh" from the audience deserving of a sick child predator with a camera stalking their next innocent victim. The look of shock on the faces of the audience made me feel as though I had suddenly been branded a pedophile. The ability of Jon Perry to twist my taking photographs of reckless behavior by our students for there own safety into questioning my reason when he was fully aware of my cause is inexcusable.

How Jon Perry came up with this word manipulation from me being a child safety advocate to a sleazy pedophile was a new low even for him. This clearly shows the depths he will sink to for the political gain of his favored few in the upcoming primary election.
